Squares are \$20 each.

Numbers will be randomly selected once all squares are sold.

The payoff will be as follows:

1st quarter	\$ 500.00	25%
Halftime	\$ 500.00	25%
3rd quarter	\$ 500.00	25%
Final score	\$ 500.00	25%

How to Win

Each box has two numbers related to it. One for New England. One for the Seattle. If, at the end of any quarter, the numbers related to your box match the last digit of each team's score, you win. For example, if you have a box with New England - 1 and Seattle - 7 and the halftime score is New England 21 Seattle 7, you would win.

If the board isn't full there may be a quarter with no winner. If this happens that money will be allocated evenly to the other quarters. For example, if no one wins the first quarter then the other three quarters will be allocated one-third of the pot.
