NFL SURVIVOR POOL RULES

1. You may enter no more than five times and you need to create different names for each entry or use some type of numbering system (i.e., Rowe1, Rowe2).
2. Pick one team to win each week. You may only pick a particular team *once* during the regular season. If the team you picked loses, you are eliminated. If you have multiple entries, you don't have to pick the same team for each entry.
3. Once the playoffs start, your slate is wiped clean. You may only pick a particular team *once* during the playoffs. If no team is available to pick, then you will be given a loss for the week.
4. Beginning Week 6, a loser pool will begin. The same rules apply. Your slate will be wiped clean if you make it into the playoffs.
5. Tie is the same as a loss. Forfeit is a loss.
6. Deadlines will be based on rules of the website – www.runyourpool.com.
7. Picks must be made at the following website:

8. Due to the time and effort required to administer the pool, the entry fee will be waived for the Pool Master (me).
9. If a pick is not entered for a specific week, you will automatically be assigned the biggest available favorite from games starting after the pick deadline.
10. If at the end of the season there are multiple players still alive for the Super Bowl, and there will clearly be more than one player standing after the game, the tiebreaker will be determined using my Super Bowl Props Contest. For example, if four people remain standing going into the Super Bowl, and two people pick Denver and two people pick Dallas, then two people will remain. Additional information will be distributed at that time to complete the entry forms for the Super Bowl Contest. Players may circumvent this requirement only by a unanimous vote by all remaining players. In other words, you can either elect to split the pot, or create some alternative tiebreaker such as number of first downs, provided that everyone agrees.
